Blazon. On a disc Azure, a stylized falcon's head erased, Gold Brown garnished Brun (Spice Brown), beak and eyed Or, pupil and nostril Sable, langued Gules, all within a narrow border Black.

Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "54TH AIRCRAFT MAINTENACE SQ" in Black letters.

Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "DUTY PRIDE RESPECT" in Black letters.

Motto. Duty Pride Respect.

Significance. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The falcon signifies the graceful yet powerful, lightning-fast bird that embodies the speed and lethality of air operations. The unit motto is "DUTY PRIDE RESPECT.".

Narrative.

The unit was originally designated and activated on 15 January 1983 as the 4456th Aircraft Generation Squadron at Macdill AFB, Florida, reporting to the 56th Tactical Training (later, 56th Fighter) Wing. There it provided flightline maintenance supporting the wing's F-16 training mission. The squadron supervised the 63d and 72d Aircraft Maintenance Units. On 2 July 1987, the unit became unmanned when all personnel and assets were combined back into the 56th Aircraft Generation Squadron. On 1 April 1994, the squadron was reassigned to Ninth Air Force. On 15 May 1994, the unit was inactivated. On 20 February 2014, the unit was redesignated as the 54th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, and activated on 1 March 2014 at Holloman AFB, New Mexico. Assigned to the 54th Fighter Group, the squadron accomplishes flightline maintenance in support of the group's mission to train world's greatest F-16 pilots and maintainers while deploying mission ready warfighters.
